

Farm Show to host rodeo champ finals

HARRISBURG — The 1980 World Series of Professional Rodeo will again be featured at the Farm Show Arena Complex in Harrisburg, November 15 and 16.

This is the American Final Rodeo, where only the top cowboys and cowgirls of the Rodeo Association are invited to compete. Winners receive cash prizes, totaling over \$35,000 plus gold and silver trophy belt buckles, saddles, horse trailers. They also will be named American Rodeo Association's World Champion bareback and saddle bronc rider, roper, steer wrestler, girls barrel racer, and bull rider.

This year competition will begin at 8 p.m. Saturday the 15th and Sunday afternoon at 2:30 November 16.

Rodeo and Western apparel is the rage all over the country this year, and

Central Pennsylvania is no exception. There will be Western wear and Saddle Shops along with Indian jewelry, crafts and other concessions at the arena.

At least one area motel is planning a Bar-b-que and Urban Cowboy Dance for the Rodeo weekend.

Miss Rodeo Pennsylvania will be in competition at the Finals as will Miss American Finals Rodeo, the Queen of the 1980 show.

This Rodeo has been considered by many as the finest professional Rodeo anywhere in the North American Continent. The bucking stock is selected only from the best rodeo contractors and only his toughest or hardest to ride broncs and bulls are sent to the Finals contest here. Even these Rodeo animals

are famous and champions in their own right.

Tickets may be reserved by calling 717/238-2816, or purchased at the Farm Show Arena ticket gate beginning November 5th from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The Rodeo is sponsored by the American Finals Rodeo Commission in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Farm Products Show Commission and the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

numbered 20. All suggested policies gained the members' approval.

Several of the recommendations spurred interest and lively discussion. Among the adopted policies were the following: that PFA support the start up of the undamaged nuclear reactor at Three Mile Island; that there be one car inspection per year instead of every six months as at present; that the state legislature only count votes

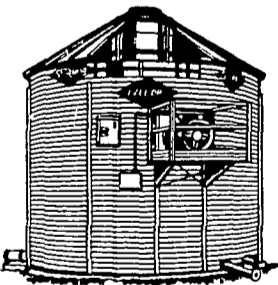
of legislators who are present on the floor at the time of vote.

Other recommendations were: farm product price be quoted at farm price not terminal market prices; that a safe level of antibiotics, pesticides, and fungicides be tolerated in all farm products; that eggs be sold by the pound not by the dozen; that the Urner-Barry method of pricing eggs be replaced by a regional pricing council consisting of

quality product producers in that region.

Several dates were noted with emphasis on Meet-the-Candidates Night to be held on October 13 at 7:30 p.m. at the Adams County National Bank-North Branch Office on Business Route 15N, Gettysburg.

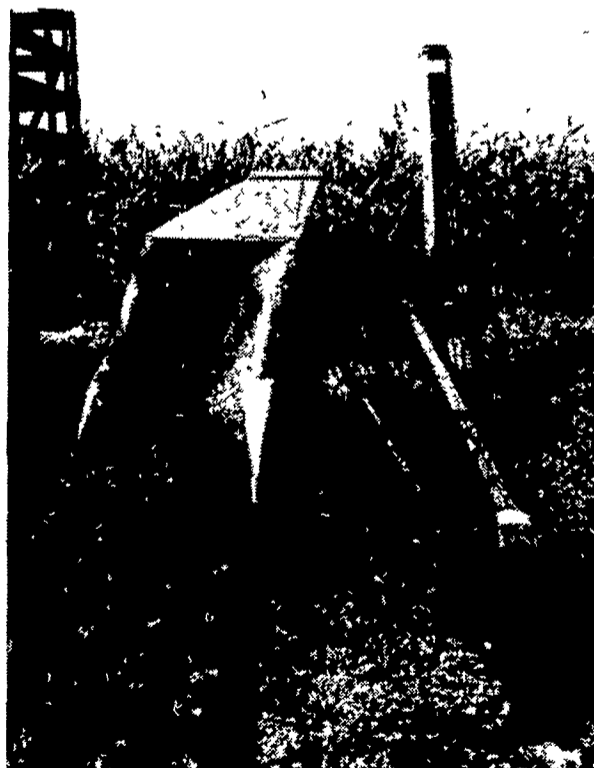
