Maryland 4-H team wins honors

TIMONIUM, Md. - For the second time in 18 days, the Maryland 4-H livestock judging team finished in the top five in regional youth contests at major East Coast livestock

The team placed third last Wednesday in a field of 15 state FFA and 4-H teams during the Eastern National Livestock Show at Timonium, Md. It was also first on September 13 among nine youth teams from five states competing at the Eastern States Exposition in West Springfield, Mass.

Both accomplishments were identical to the achievements of last year's Maryland team. The victory at West Springfield marked the fifth consecutive year of livestock judging domination by Maryland 4-H teams at the Eastern States Exposition.




