

Champions named at KILE Feeder Calf Show

HARRISBURG — Out-of-state exhibitors took grand championship titles in the 24th Keystone International Livestock Exposition Feeder Calf Show held here at the Farm Show Complex.

Ralph Warren, Jr. of War-Low Farm, Lewisburg, West Virginia, showed his pen of Chianina*Angus*Simmental crossbred steers to the title of grand champion pen of the show.

Another West Virginia exhibitor, Robert Sherwood of Maxwelton, showed the second place pen of

crossbred steers which was later named reserve grand champion of the show.

Erdenheim Farm of Lafayette Hill, Montgomery County, captured the first place title with their pen of five Angus feeder steers.

Green Countains Earl and Williams Renner of Waynesburg showed the first place pen of Hereford feeder steers.

Woodside Farm, also from Waynesburg, exhibited the top Shorthorn pen of five feeder steers.

In the feeder heifer class,

Dresden Farm of Middleburg, Virginia, showed the top Angus pen and the first place crossbred pen of feeder heifers. Dresden Farm's entries were also named champion and reserve champion of the feeder heifer show.

Milk support price to be \$12.80

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland has announced the support price for manufacturing milk will be \$12.80 per hundredweight for the new marketing year which began October 1.

The announced price is for milk with a milkfat content of 3.5 percent and compares with the present support of \$12.07.

The support price for milk with the U.S. annual average milkfat content of 3.67 percent will be \$13.10, compared with the present support of \$12.36.

It was announced on September 19 that the support price for manufacturing milk would be set at 80 percent of the October 1 parity price based on data published in USDA's "agricultural prices" report released.

The law requires that milk be supported at a level between 80 and 90 percent to assure an adequate supply of milk. Given current supply-demand and price estimates, the \$12.80 support price level will assure adequate future milk production.

The support for milk is achieved by Commodity Credit Corporation's (CCC) purchase of butter, cheese and nonfat dry milk.

The prices at which CCC will offer dairy products for sale for unrestricted use will continue to be 105 percent of the current purchase prices for these products. CCC's purchase prices for butter, nonfat dry milk and cheese are shown on page 2:

The price of butter located at any other point outside these cities will be the price at New York City minus 80 percent of the lowest published domestic railroad through freight rate for frozen butter in effect on October 1 of each marketing year from such other point in New York City.

The appropriate freight rate will be calculated on a per pound gross weight basis for a 60,000-pound carlot.

However, the price at any location shall be not less than the purchase price of New York City minus three cents per pound.

For any location in Wisconsin or Kentucky, the price shall not exceed the purchase price at Chicago which for butter produce on or after October 1 will be \$1.49 per pound.
