available for repair of low-income housing in government programs, this action should help bring more federal dollars where they are desperately needed," Mercure said.

FmHA's 46 state directors will work with other organizations which have home weatherization programs and conduct outreach programs to locate and inform low-income rural residents of FmHA's program.

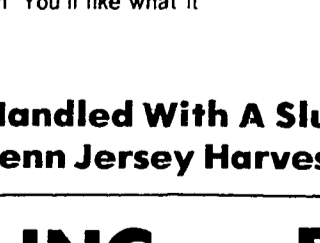
The home repair program is one of several steps that have been taken recently by FmHA to promote conservation of petroleum and natural gas. The changes affect portions of all of FmHA's major program areas. These areas include farm, housing, community facility and business and industrial programs.

"All FmHA programs have some indirect impact on energy usage, while most programs have a direct impact in rural areas," Mercure said.

"For example, the location of community facilities financed through FmHA will have a direct bearing on the transportation energy demands in a community. In the farm

sector the increasing costs of economic stability of the farm fuel threatens the American farmer."

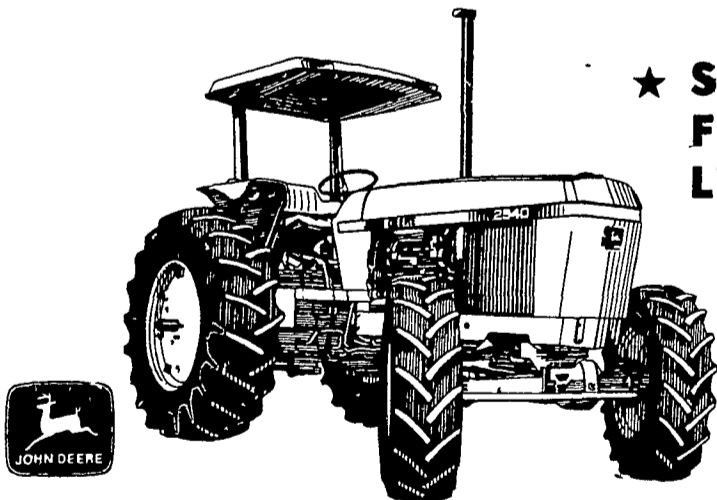

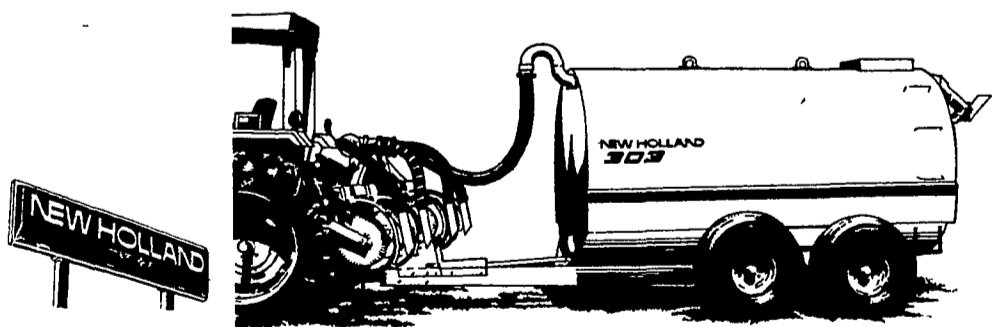
