The new queen has been involved in 4-H for eight years and has twenty-two registered Suffolk sheep of her own.

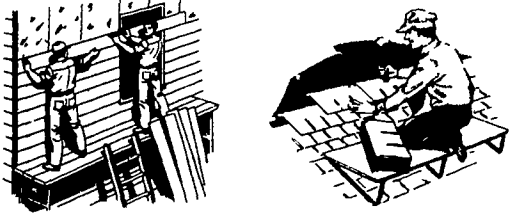
She was sponsored by the Washington County Sheep and Wool Growers Association.
