Interest rate lowered for emergency loans

WASHINGTON, DC - The Farmers Home Administration has reduced the interest rates on its emergency farm production and real estate loans, Alex R. Mercure. assistant secretary of agriculture for rural development, said Monday.

He also said: The rate for emergency disaster loans to help borrowers restore agricultural production and to finance major farm operations was reduced to 12.5 percent from 13.5 percent.

Interest for farm real estate loans under the emergency disaster program was lowered to 11 percent from 12.5 percent.

All loans under the new program now carry the new rates.

The five percent interest rate for loans to cover actual physical and production losses caused by weather disasters remains unchanged.

Farmers Home Administration interest rates are calculated mostly through use of a formula specified by law, involving the cost of money to the government.


