Each year at least 50 of the 12.000 teachers of vocationa agriculture in the nation are awarded the Honorary American Farmer Degree.

The Degree is awarded on the basis of points scored by

Teachers are awarded points for each student they supervised in earning state and national FFA awards. Teachers also receive points for serving as officers and committee members of the National Vocational Agriculture Teachers' Association and for their participation in national meetings of the FFA and professional other associations

a teacher for his ac-Charles Ackley is one of complishments as a four vocational agriculture teachers from Pennsylvania to be nominated for the Degree this year.


