

Order 4 base to be \$13.47

ALEXANDRIA, VA — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine announced last Friday a September 1980 base milk price of \$13.47 per hundredweight and an excess milk price of \$12.03.

The weighted average September price is \$13.47 and the butterfat differential for the month is 16.7 cents.

The base milk price increased 26 cents from the previous month and is 79 cents higher than last September's base price.

The advertising withholding rate, which is deducted from the base and excess milk prices only and not the weighted average price, was 12 cents a hundredweight this year compared to 7 cents a year ago.

The gross value of producer milk during September was \$62.3 million. A total of \$556.2 thousand was deducted for advertising and promotion.

Shine said producer receipts totaled 463.5 million pounds during September, an increase of one percent from the previous month, on a daily basis, and 5.7 percent above last September. Class I producer milk

totalled 255.4 million pounds and accounted for 55.11 percent of total producer milk receipts during the month, up from 48.04 percent in August and 53.35 percent last September.

Base milk accounted for 91.89 percent of total producer milk receipts in September, up from 91.06 percent a year earlier.

There were 7325 producers supplying Order 4 handlers during the month and the average daily delivery per producer of 2,109 pounds was up 23 pounds from August and was 81 pounds or four percent above last September. There were 117 more producers than a year ago.

The average butterfat test of producer milk was 3.53 percent for the month

compared to 3.46 percent in August and 3.54 percent one year ago.

Middle Atlantic Order pool handlers reported Class I in-area milk sales of 7.0 million

pounds per day during September, a decrease of 1.4 percent from a year ago, after adjustment to eliminate variation due to calendar composition.
