

Aid may be available for aflatoxin corn

CHESTERTOWN, Md. — The 1980 drought in Maryland appears to be doing a double whammy on corn growers in St. Marys and Charles counties as reports indicate that some of what corn did manage to grow in those counties is heavily infested with aflatoxin. Aflatoxin infested corn is

all but useless on the market as it can not be formulated safely into most animal feed products. According to Maryland Department of Agriculture Marketing Specialist Bradley H. Powers, farmers can receive some assistance through the low yield payment programs of the Agricultural Stabilization

and Conservation Service which are now operating in most Maryland counties as a result of the 1980 drought. "Farmers who have had one or more loads rejected by a grain buyer due to high aflatoxin levels should secure a written statement from the buyer to that effect. The notice of rejection will allow ASCS to certify crop loss and thus possibly qualify the farmer for

assistance," Powers said. "The important thing for farmers to remember is that after ASCS has certified the field as a total loss it will have to be disked under and the corn not used for any other purpose," he said. Having one field certified as a loss does not automatically qualify the entire farm for low yield payments. Each field must be handled separately with

payments based on an average of all of the fields. "Farmers should contact their local ASCS office for details and check out all the factors involved. So far, St. Marys and Charles seem

to be the main problem areas, but corn growers throughout the state should carefully check their fields as they might be able to qualify for this program," Powers said.
