## Milk production climbs

HARRISBURG — Milk production in Pennsylvania during September 1980 totaled 700 million pounds, up three percent from a year earlier, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The number of milk cows in the commonwealth during September was 714,000 head, up 9000 head from a year ago. Milk production per cow averaged 980 pounds in September, up 15 pounds from a year ago.

United States milk production during September totaled 10.4 billion pounds, three percent above September 1979.

Milk production per cow average 952 pounds, 23 pounds more than a year earlier and 56 pounds above September 1978.

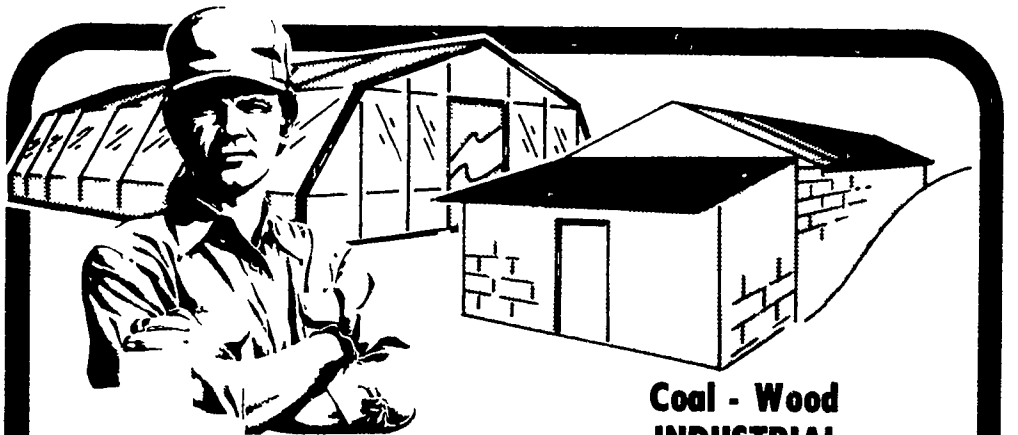
