PASTRY

2 cups sifted flour
2/3 cups lard
1/4 teaspoon salt
7 tablespoons cold milk

Combine three ingredients and mix until crumbly. Add milk.

APPLE NUT CAKE

1/4 pound butter or margarine
2 cups sugar
2 eggs, beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 teaspoons baking soda
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 cups flour
3 cups apples, chopped fine
1/2 cup walnuts

Cream shortening and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla. Beat until creamy. Sift cinnamon, flour, soda and salt. Add to creamed mixture. Next, add apples and nuts. Pour into greased and floured 9" x 13" pan. Bake at 350 degrees for about 45 minutes.




