## Order 2 dairymen to get \$13.31

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Market Administrator Dairy farmers supplying milk plants regulated under the New York - New Jersey marketing orders during September will be paid on the basis of a uniform price of \$13.31 per hundred pounds or 28.6 cents per quart.

Thomas A. Wilson, who announced September's price, also said the uniform farm price was \$13.01 per hundredweight in August 1980 and \$12.51 per hundredweight in September, 1979.

The uniform price is a marketwide weighted average of the value of farm milk used for fluid and manufactured dairy products.

The seasonal incentive fund returned a total of \$3,711,058.21 or \$.450 per hundredweight to the dairy farmer's uniform price for September. This fund was generated by reducing the uniform price paid producers during the high production spring months.

The total amount of milk received from the 17,539 dairy farmers supplying the New York - New Jersey Marketing Area was 824,866,429 pounds during September 1980. This was almost 19.2 million pounds above last year. The gross value to dairy farmers for milk deliveries was \$110,608,973.85.

Wilson explained this included differentials required to be paid to dairy farmers but not voluntary premiums or deductions authorized by the farmer.

Regulated milk dealers (handlers) utilized 394,220,574 pounds or 47.8 percent of the total amount of milk for Class I. The Class I milk is used for fluid products such as

homogenized, flavored, low-test and skim milks. For September 1980, handlers paid \$13.98 per hundredweight, or 30.1 cents per quart, for the milk used in Class 1 products compared with \$13.12 a year ago.

The balance of the milk, 52.2 percent, was used to manufacture Class II products including butter, cheese, ice cream and yogurt. For this milk the handlers paid \$12.13 per hundredweight.

The uniform price is based on milk containing 3.5 percent butterfat. For September 1980, a differential of 16.7 cents was applied to the price for each one-tenth of one percent that the milk tested above or below the 3.5 percent standard.

All prices quoted are for bulk tank milk received within the 201-210 mile zone from New York City.
