

Delmarva bean growers meet Chinese delegation

SALISBURY — Maryland Soybean growers joined the American Soybean Association in Washington, D.C. to host a delegation of visiting agricultural officials from the People's Republic of China. The PRC delegation was in the nation's capital late in September on the first leg of a visit of U.S. soybean and

cotton production areas. The visit to the United States was in response to a recent trade mission to the PRC by ASA leaders.

"We think there is tremendous potential for increased soybean sales to China," says Maryland soybean board chairman, Leon Schmick. "This year China stepped up purchases of U.S. soybeans to cover one million metric tons. That's up from 850,000 tons in 1979 which was a ten-fold increase over the 85,000 tons China purchased in 1978.

"With a quarter of the world's population to feed and the Chinese government's commitment to improving diets by providing more meat, we feel confident that China will develop into one of our major markets for soybeans," says Schmick.

He added that in coming months soybean growers will be investing a portion of their grower investment checkoff funds in market development activities to help increase soybean sales to the PRC.

Maryland soybean producers, William S. Bradley of Salisbury, Henry Spies Jr. of Cordova, Leon Schmick of Preston and Milton Malkus Jr. of Cambridge, met for dinner with the delegation of 15 Chinese agricultural officials headed by the Vice Minister of the State Agricultural Commission of the Peking Government, U.S. Senator Thad Cochran, Representative G. V. "Sonny" Montgomery and Representative David Bowen's agricultural committee staff aid also joined the group for dinner. Both congressmen indicated America's eagerness and ability to supply the potentially vast Chinese market with additional soybean and cotton sales
