A strong demand for bull calves highlighted Stonen Farm's first sale Sept. 27 at Arkport, N.Y.

Local support by breeders was matched by Pennsylvania buyers and buyers from nine other states and Canada to keep prices consistent throughout the sale which grossed \$104,375 for a sale average of \$2026 on the 51 lots offered by Stonen Farm and guest consignor Marshall Farms of Port Byron, N.Y.

The highest selling lot was GWH Miss Laddie 4443, a March 1974 daughter of ABHY Anxiety Lad 22A bred to Justification, and her 75J heifer calf, SF Miss Banner 75J M40, going to Ace Polled Herefords, Millbrook, N.Y. for \$6200.

A half transplant interest is a LS Beau Visitor 1-30 daughter was sold to Herb Marshall, Port Byron, N.Y. for \$5,000.

The third highest selling offering was a cow-calf pair that totaled \$4750 with Scotchwater Farm, Clarence, N.Y. paying \$2,250 for Klondike Vicki 357G, a Finch N30 daughter, and Mont-Vue Farms, Niota, Tenn. paying \$2,500 for her 75J heifer calf.

A feature of the sale that attracted a good deal of attention was the option offered buyers to leave their bull calves at Stonen Farm for participation in its third on-farm bull test. Several buyers elected to take advantage of this option including Home Acres, Perry, N.Y. buyer of the high selling bull calf, SF Sundance Rock M57 out of Wild Cat Sundance 7K for \$2000.

The 15 bull calves averaged \$780. Stonen Farm bulls and bull calves have sold well at private treaty and at consignment sale and this acceptance by breeders

was evident by the demand at the sale.


