He said singers will select by mail based on tape-recorded auditions, applications listing singing experience and recommendations from the member's state FFA association, vocational agriculture instructor and choir director. Maryland honey flow falters

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Honey production this year in Maryland is 20 to 30 percent below normal, reports Dewey M. Caron, extension apiculture specialist and professor of entomology at the University of Maryland.

The 1980 state honey yield is estimated at 400 thousand pounds-down from approximately 490 thousand pounds last year.

Production was generally spotty throughout the state, Caron says, with some beekeepers doing well and others, a few miles away, reporting poor results.


Western Maryland fared better than other regions of the state, and he expects the honey crop in that area to be about average.

The state's generally poor honey production can be blamed mostly on hot, dry weather this summer. It means bad news for beekeepers next year because many colonies are low on winter honey stores.
