Chain saw seminar to run Thursday

CHRISTIANA, Del. — With rapidly rising fuel costs many people are installing wood stoves and cutting their own wood. This resurgence in wood harvesting has prompted many consumers to buy chain saws. As a result, the "weekend lumberjack" has become the prime user of these useful machines.

Because this powerful tool can also be very dangerous, a chain saw safety seminar has been scheduled for Thursday, November 6 at 7 p.m. at the Christiana Fire Hall located at the intersections of Route 7 and 273.

It is estimated that this year chain saws will be responsible for more than 80,000 reported accidents ranging from cut fingers to sudden death. Such accidents can be prevented, says University of Delaware extension safety specialist Ron Jester.

"It's up to each of us as chain saw users to know our machine's limitations and capabilities, be familiar with operation and maintenance procedures, and use it safely. A chain saw in the hands of an irresponsible operator can be an extremely dangerous piece of equipment," he says.

Topics to be covered at the seminar include: chain saw maintenance, sharpening your chain saw, handling fuel safely, using chain saws

safely, first aid for common chain saw injuries, the noise problem, and how to safely fell a tree.

A professional chain saw operator, chain saw manufacturer's representative, state forester, fire safety and emergency medical technician will share their concerns in regards to chain saw safety and related topics. There will also be chain saw exhibits with related products.

This seminar is sponsored by the Extension Service, in cooperation with the Forestry Section of the Delaware Department of Agriculture, the Delaware State Fire School, and Christiana Volunteer Fire Company

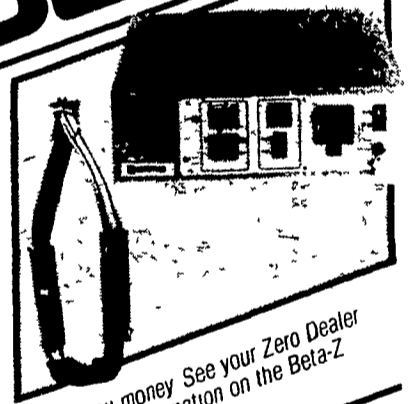

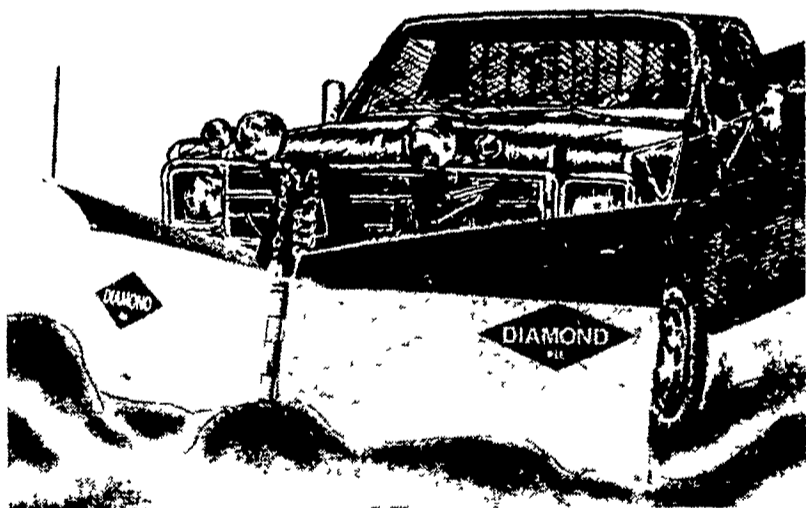
