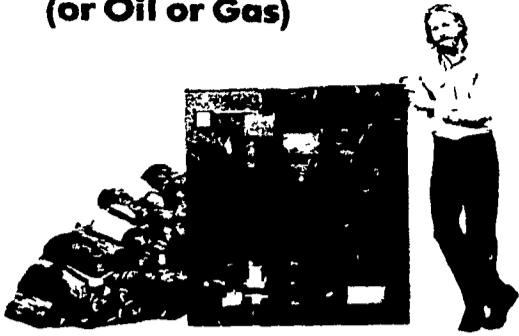

781 receive American Farmer Degree

The American Farmer Degree, highest degree of achievement in the Future Farmers of America Organization, will be presented on November 13 to 781 of the nation's most distinguished FFA members. The award will be presented at a special ceremony to be held during the Thursday afternoon session of the FFA's 53rd Annual National Convention.

The 781 FFA members being awarded the American Farmer Degree this year represent the best of more than 481,676 FFA members enrolled in the nation's 8,236 high school vocational agriculture departments. Recipients of the American Farmer Degree are involved in both production agriculture and in agribusiness occupations that support the nation's farmers.

FFA members begin as "Greenhands" and after one year of membership may be advanced by the local chapter to the degree of "Chapter Farmer."

The third degree, that of "State Farmer", is presented by the State FFA Association and is limited to no more than one percent of the state's FFA membership in any one year. Only students who have earned the State Farmer Degree are eligible for the

American Farmer Degree. The American Farmer Degree is presented only by the National Organization. States are permitted to submit names of candidates for the American Farmer Degree based on total FFA membership in the state.

In addition to having earned the State Farmer Degree, candidates for the American Farmer Degree must have been active members of the FFA continuously for at least three years. They must have a record of participation in local and state FFA activities and they must have completed all the vocational agriculture instruction offered in their high school.

Candidates must have been out of high school for at least a year and must have in operation an outstanding supervised farming or agribusiness occupational program. American Farmer applicants must have earned at least \$1,000 by their own efforts through their occupational experience program and must have their earnings productively invested or deposited in a bank.

Finally, the American Farmer candidates must have demonstrated outstanding ability through their leadership and cooperation in student, chapter and community

activities. They must also have a satisfactory scholarship record as certified by the local school superintendent or principal.

Each American Farmer Degree recipient is presented a gold key and a certificate in recognition of his or her accomplishments. If he or she attends the convention, the recipient is presented a check from the Future Farmers of America Foundation to help pay travel expenses.

Two join FFA band

LANCASTER — Two Pennsylvania FFA'ers will be among the 108 band members who will perform at the 53rd National FFA Convention.

They are Mark Canan, West Middlesex, playing a percussion instrument and Richard Krout, Rebersburg, playing the French Horn.

Representing 41 states, the 1980 National FFA Band members were selected through the mail based on tape-recorded auditions, applications listing band experiences and written recommendations.

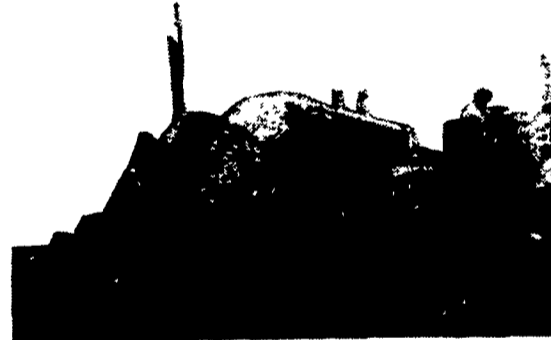
Roger Heath, former director of California Polytechnic State University Bands, will direct the National FFA Band. He will

be assisted by James Tibbs, Associate Supervisor of Music Education in Fairfax County, Virginia, and Roland Rutz of the Montgomery Public Schools in Montgomery, Minnesota.

"We'll play a wide variety of music including marches, rock tunes, selections from Broadway musicals, serious music and mood music," Heath said.

The band members have only two days to rehearse together before they start playing at the convention sessions. The Carnation Company sponsors the group as a special project of the National FFA Foundation, Inc., by helping pay expenses and hosting a dinner for the bandmen.
