Both Gerald and Jesse will be traveling to the National 4-H Congress in Chicago in late November.

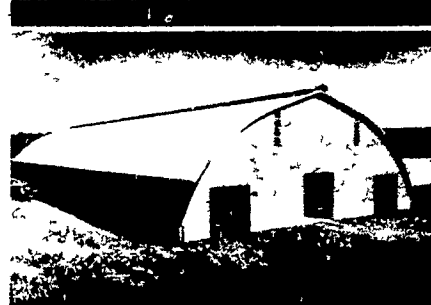
Junior Achievement Awards were presented to Angie Thomas of Greencastle and Ronnie Stull of Waynesboro.

presented on a county level to 4-H'ers 13 years and under based on blue form scores.

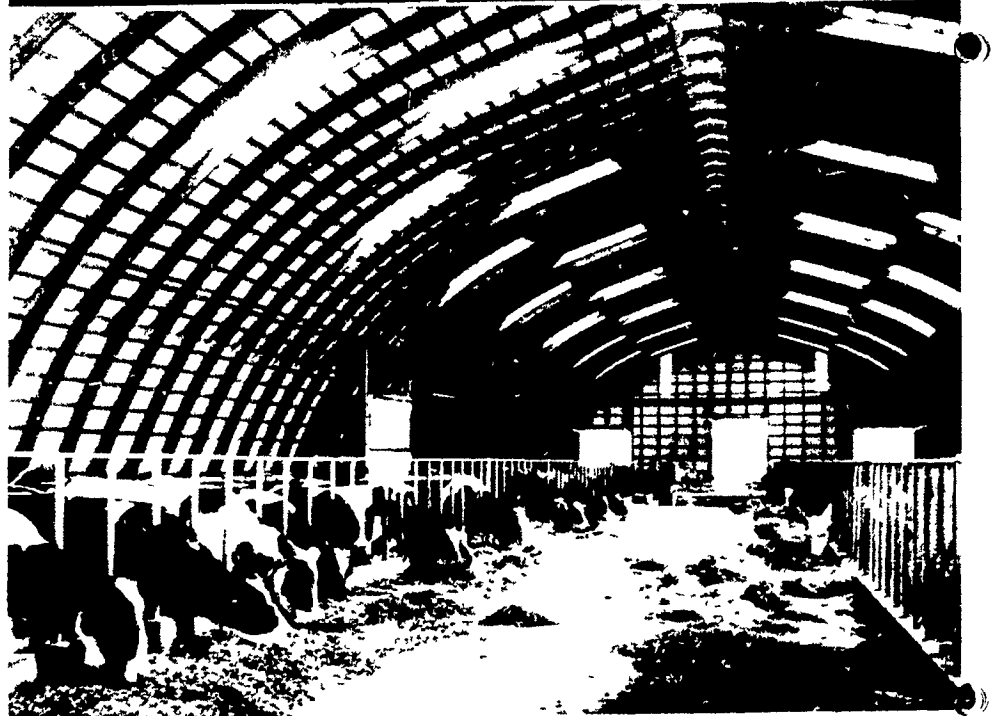

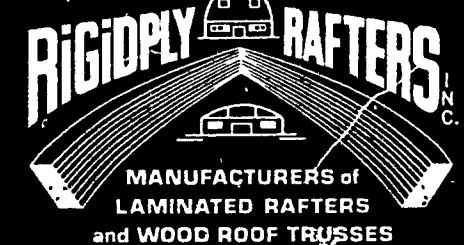
