

## Who needs standards?

**YORK** — Suppose every time you needed a new battery for your flashlight — or watch, or transistor radio, or calculator — you had to determine the exact voltage, shape, terminal arrangement, and chemical composition required. Furthermore, you realized that the only manufacturer of that battery was the company that made the flashlight.

No way, you say: Marcell A. Seckman, Extension Home Economist, says that thanks to the American National Standards Institute, we consumers are saved the hassle of pulling together all that information every time we wish to make a purchase. Batteries, as you know, come in standard sizes and power ratings, identified by a simple code letter or number.

If your flashlight requires size D batteries, you can select the brand name, type (flashlight, heavy duty, alkaline, etc.) and price you want, knowing that any size D battery will fit.

The American National Standards Institute, (ANSI), is an organization which sets up voluntary standards for many consumer products. Manufacturers who comply with these standards know that consumers benefit

through interchangeability and freedom of choice.

Today there are more than 10,000 ANSI approved standards for such consumer items as gas and electrical appliances, camera film, cooking utensils, light bulbs, and textiles.

Some standards are developed by ANSI committees, made up of volunteers who represent manufacturers, users, distributors, consumers, and government. Others result from the work of technical and professional organizations, trade associations, and labor and consumer groups that cooperate with ANSI and submit standards to it for consensus and approval.
