Ephrata area. This trip will be financed by the EJHS magazine sales program.

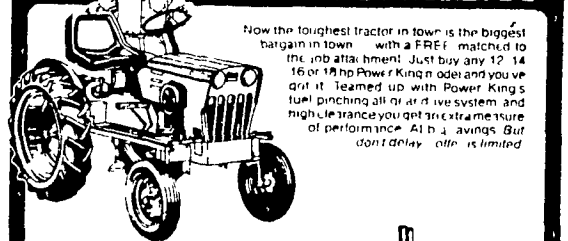
The highlight for the year will be to conduct an embryology project in the spring. This involves studying embryo development while incubating eggs in a classroom incubator to

The officers will conduct business meetings twice each month and practice basic parliamentary procedure.

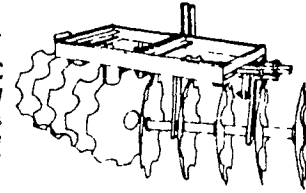
