

Deadlines approach for Jersey awards

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Who is a Master Jersey Breeder?

The American Jersey Cattle Club, Columbus, Ohio, bestows an annual Master Breeder Award upon an AJCC member, family, partnership or corporation who, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, has bred outstanding animals for many years and thereby made a notable contribution to the advancement of the Jersey breed in the United States.

Applications are due in the national office February 1, 1981.

Applications for the Young Jersey Dairyman Award and the Distinguished Service Award are also due February 1. The Young Jersey Dairyman Award is

earned by Jersey breeders under 36 years of age as of January 1, 1981, who merit recognition for expertise in dairy farming and Jersey cattle breeding; for participation in AJCC programs; and for leadership in Jersey activities.

The Distinguished Service Award is presented to individuals who have rendered outstanding and unselfish service for many years, thereby making a notable contribution to the advancement of the Jersey breed in the United States.

Along the production line the AJCC sponsors a contest to recognize Living Lifetime Production Champions.

The contest is based on

official production records for pounds of milk and fat produced during a cow's entire lifetime. Cows nominated for the contest must have been living on December 31, 1980, and have produced over 100,000 pounds of milk or 5000 pounds fat. Nominations are due March 1, 1981.

Whom do you know that deserves recognition for efforts to advance the Jersey breed? Nominate them, today.
