science and eventually get into farming."

The reserve grand champion steer was also exhibited by a Chester County 4-H'er. The judges went with the champion heavyweight Limousin x Simmental cross led by Gary Walker of R1 West Chester.

This was Walker's last year to show in 4-H — so the championship with Red, the steer, was a big one for the nineteen-year-old. Walker also led Red to the reserve championship at the local Goshen Fair in August — not a bad way to end a five-year career..

Walker, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Walker, is currently in the electrical construction business since his graduation from Henderson High School. His sale of 1230-pound Red to Lancaster's Watt & Shand Department Store for 87 cents a pound will be a welcomed reward for a year of hard work.

The reserve champion lightweight steer was exhibited by Jeff Walker, also from Chester County. He sold his 1120-pound steer for 78 cents a pound — netting \$873.60. Together, these three steers captured the Trio trophy for their county.

The reserve champion heavyweight steer was exhibited by Lancaster County's Michelle Dean. She received 78 cents for her heavyweight's 1195 pounds, a total of \$932.10.

In showmanship competition, Debra Greider was selected as the top showman of the day. She was the reserve champion showman at the Lancaster County Roundup on Monday.

Greider, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Greider of R2 Columbia, has been showing beef cattle for the past 8 years.

Her entry this year was an Angus x Hereford x Limousin crossbred purchased from Ken Brubaker. She commented she already has her 1981 project steer, an

Angus x Simmental, also purchased from Brubaker.

Greider is presently serving as the Red Rose Beef Club's queen. Although she was born and raised on a dairy farm, Greider commented that she became interested in showing beef cattle through watching her brothers get their projects ready.

"I got interested because I thought it looked like a lot of fun," she said.

Through fun, hard work, and determination, Greider has been recognized as the top showman at the District show.

Although the sale of the grand champion did not break last year's record of \$2.14 a pound paid for Chester County's Gordon Smith's steer, the sale reflected a lot of local support for the 4-H program.

There were 79 head sold on Tuesday afternoon for a total of \$72,742.05. The average weight for each steer came to 1156 pounds and the average price was \$7959.

There were more than 50 different buyers at the sale, some of whom included Pennfield Corporation, Hamilton Bank, Walter Dunlap & Sons, McCoy Cattle Co., J.M. Hoover, Bell Telephone, Kunzler & Co., Baums Bologna, Lawn Equipment Parts, and out-of-state buyers from Virginia markets.

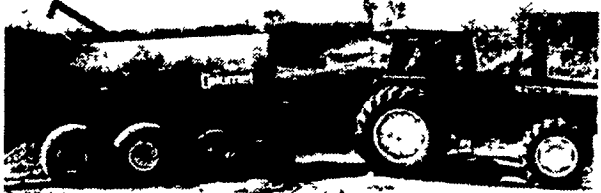

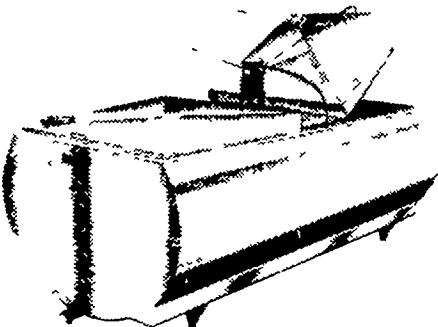
