Compared to last week slaughter steers and heifers continued their downward price tumble for the sixth consecutive week. Slaughter steers finished the week .50 to 1.00 lower. Heifers 1.50, instances 2.00 lower. Cows and bulls remained steady Trade on slaughter steers and heifers moderate both Monday and Wednesday with prices the lowest since early June. Majority of receipts consisting of predominantely YG 3-4 consignments; therefore forcing buyers to be even more selective. Receipts this week were about 4100 as compared to 3284 a week ago and 4075 a year ago.
