Eastern Outdoor Show to run

HARRISBURG — The 26th annual Eastern Sports and Outdoor Show is scheduled to open for a nine-day run, Saturday, February 7, through Sunday, February 15, at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Building.

Show Director Richard Libertine said this will be the longest run in the history of the sports and outdoor show. He said the addition of another day was made necessary by the extraordinarily large attendance of last year's show.

Libertine noted all of the most popular sports show

activities will be back, including the week-long archery tournament; duck and turkey calling contests; duck decoy carving and painting competitions; and the Pennsylvania Jaycees/Daisy BB Gun Winter Championship Match, featuring school-age sharpshooters. Anglers will not want to miss the fly-tying contest and daily fishing clinics.

Several new special events, Libertine noted, are now being planned and will be announced closer to the opening date.

As in previous years, this will be a complete sports and outdoor show. Exhibitors from throughout the United States and Canada will display the latest in hunting, fishing, camping and backpacking gear. Boats and marine equipment will have a separate display hall, and hundreds of recreational vehicles are to be on view

The club calves will be graded before the sale by Lester Burdett, Penn State University Extension Livestock Specialist, and must have a frame score of 12 or better. These calves will be halter broke, acclimated, vaccinated for shipping fever and LBR, and on feed. They will be sold by the head with weights being announced.

The sale will be held December 5th at 7:30 p.m. at the Leesport Market and Auction, Leesport.

Offered for sale will be approximately 70 head of calves, 40 of which will be club calves, with the rest selling as feeder calves.

Also being offered for sale will be several purebred

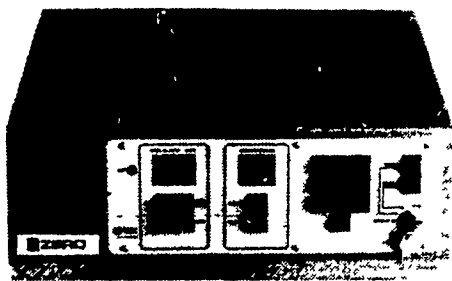
