## Milk Marketing continues to fight

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The National Association for Milk Marketing Reform, a trade association of small dairy processors, last Friday filed a motion to intervene on a limited basis to oppose the term of the Consent Judgment proposed by the Department of Justice in settlement of its lawsuit to block the merger of H.P. Hood, Inc., New England's largest dairy into Agri-Mark, the largest dairy co-op in the Area.

NAMMR's motion was filed in the United States District Court in Vermont.

The move to intervene as Amicus Curiae resulted from the Department of Justice's refusal to drop its Consent Proposal and its

rejection of NAMMR's request for a hearing.

NAMMR opposes the Consent Settlement which it believes will not protect small dairies, small cooperatives and many farmers who will be forced out of business.

The District Court must decide if the Consent Judgment is in the public interest.

NAMMR asserted in its motion that a hearing is necessary for the Court to receive additional evidence for its determination. NAMMR pointed out that the Response of Justice filed last week raised serious questions of protection for competitors and dairy farmers.
