ROAST RABBIT WITH MUSTARD

- 1 rabbit, 2 to 2½ pounds, cut into serving pieces (see below for instructions)
- 4 tablespoons butter
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- 2 tablespoons imported mustard such as Dijon or Dusseldorf
- ½ cup plus 2 teaspoons dry white wine
- 2 bay leaves
- ½ teaspoon dried thyme
- ½ cup heavy cream

If the rabbit is frozen, let it defrost overnight in the refrigerator. Preheat the oven to 450 degrees.

Heat the butter in a shallow roasting pan that will hold the rabbit pieces comfortably in one layer. Add the rabbit pieces and turn them in the butter. Sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste. Place the rabbit in the oven and bake five minutes.

Turn the pieces of rabbit and continue baking five minutes. Blend the mustard and two teaspoons of wine.

Brush the rabbit on both sides with the mustard and wine mixture.

Bake five minutes. Turn the rabbit pieces and return to the oven. Add the garlic, bay leaves, thyme and remaining half cup of wine. Cover closely with foil.

Reduce the oven heat to 375 degrees. Continue baking, basting often, about 45 minutes or until tender.

Add the cream and baste the rabbit pieces. Cover with foil and bake 15 minutes longer. Serve with noodles. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

Here is the answer to Iva Mae Love's request for Peanut Butter Pie.

- 1 cup 10x sugar
- ½ cup creamy peanut butter
- 1 baked 9" pie shell
- ½ cup cornstarch
- ¾ cup sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt


- 2 cups milk
- 3 egg yolks, beaten
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- ¼ teaspoon vanilla
- 3 egg whites

Combine 10x sugar & peanut butter to a coarse meal. Spread half mix in pie shell. Combine remaining ingredients (except egg whites) in saucepan. Cook over

medium heat, stirring constantly. Spoon over peanut butter mix in pie shell. Beat egg whites till stiff. Spread over filling. Sprinkle remaining peanut butter mix or meringue. Bake 325° for 20 minutes.

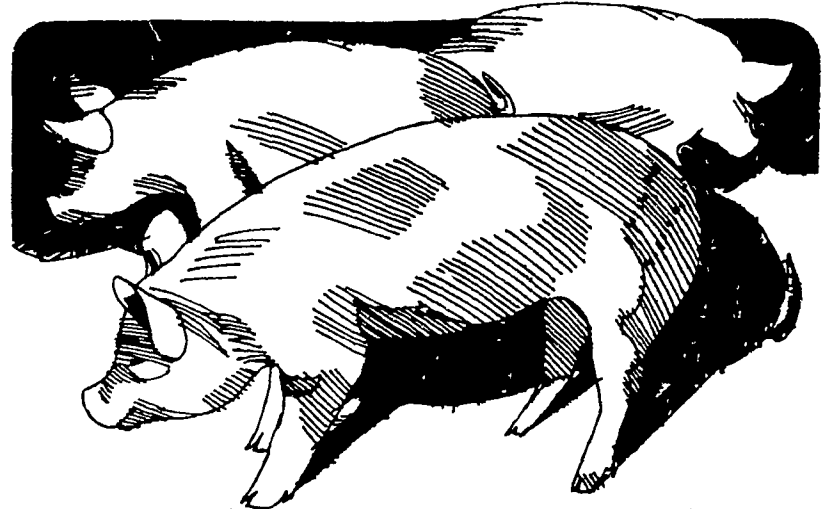

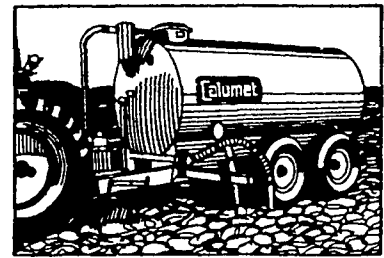
