

Frey bull is reserve grand at Louisville

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Fred C. Frey & Sons, Quarryville, exhibited the reserve grand champion Angus bull of the 1981 National Angus Show, held here November 17-18 in conjunction with the North American International Livestock Exposition.

Judge Jake White, of Panama, Oklahoma, tagged Continental as Reserve Senior Champion before awarding him the reserve grand champion banner. The bull is co-owned with Continental Associates, Phelps, New York.

After evaluating 65 bulls, White declared Sir Wms Warrant Senior and Grand Champion. Warrant, last year's national intermediate champ, is owned by Quirk Land & Cattle Co., Hastings, Nebraska, and Lovana Farms Inc., Clarksville, Georgia.

R&J Duchess 1239, Junior Champion, captured the top female title. She's owned by a syndicate composed of R&J Ranch, Briggs, Texas; Gallagher's Angus Farm, Ghent, New York; Empire Angus, Pleasant Hill, Missouri; and Picket Fence Farm, Grayslake, Illinois.

Reserve grand female was Kendall First Lady, the reserve junior winner owned by Mr. and Mrs. Sayre

MacLeod of Sayre Farms, Phelps, New York; and Deep Down Ranch of Paluxy, Texas.

Sayre Patriot sired the winning get and junior get-of-sire groups entered by Mr. and Mrs. Sayre MacLeod; Patriot International, Tuttle, Oklahoma; and Hijos De Jose Firpo, S.R.L.

R&J Ranch put together the best six head, all embryo transplant calves out of one cow, Albern Duchess 573.

Rosebank Connection 69 earned the junior bull championship for Rally Farms, Millbrook, New York; Rosebank Angus Farm, Georgetown, New York; and Timber Valley Farms, Dawn, Missouri. Reserve junior honors went to Summitcrest Puritan, exhibited by Briarwood Associates, West Bend, Wisconsin, and Summitcrest Farms, Summitville, Ohio.

Mr. and Mrs. W.B. Henley of Paso Robles, California, and Weaver Angus Farm of Peoria, Illinois, won the intermediate champion bull trophy with Creston Mr. America.

Skarship Farm, Hillsdale, New York, claimed the reserve intermediate bull spot with Skarship Educator and took senior bull calf

honors with Skarship Primmover.

Darle Dawes & Family, Urbana, Indiana, picked up the reserve senior calf ribbon with DD Black Stud 929.

7S High Caliber 037 topped the junior bull calf division for Darrell and Mike Sundsbak, Des Lacs, North Dakota.

ERA Black Coupon 001 moved into reserve for Earle Rigler, LaPorte, Indiana, and Robert Zeedyk, New Carlisle, Indiana.

In female competition, Leland J. Boggs, Claverak, New York, exhibited Sir Williams Patricia 982 to the intermediate championship.

Clover Hills Royal Lady stepped into the reserve

intermediate spot for Kevin Swain and family of Marshall, Indiana, and Premier Angus Inc., Cloverdale, Indiana.

Pride Easton M 673 earned the senior calf trophy for Mott Cattle Co., Maher, Colorado, while Briarhill Joan took reserve honors for a group made up of Briarwood Angus Farm, Butler,

Missouri; Briarhill Angus Farm, Union Springs, Alabama; Lovana Farms; and Picket Fence Farms, Grayslake, Illinois.

Gallagher's Angus and Sayre Farms topped the junior heifer calf competition with Patriots Jestress Gal 160F, and R&J Ranch stood in reserve with R&J Duchess 740.

HA Miss Elra. Herb Lou Miss Patriot 07 won first in the April junior yearling class for Sharon Duble, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Todd Dawes, Urbana, Indiana, took the blue ribbon in the late summer yearling

competition with DD Miss Black Ancher 749 and won the early senior calf division with DD Miss Super Lady 939.

Angus breeders elect new president

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Myron Woolever, a registered Angus breeder from Unionville, Missouri, was elected president of the American Angus Association on November 17, during the 97th Annual Meeting of Delegates, here

Woolever, replaces Dave

Pingrey, retiring president from Benton, Mississippi. Woolever has been in the Angus business all his life. He took over his father's herd in 1945. His Greencrest Farms at Unionville is well known throughout breeding circles.

Woolever has been active as an Angus leader for many years, having served as president of the Missouri Angus Association, the Northeast Missouri Angus Association and the Sheridan Valley Angus Association. Woolever was elected to the board of directors of the American Angus Association in 1975.

Charles Cannon was selected as the Association's new vice president. He is a partner in Stone Gate Farms, a registered Angus cattle operation near Flemingsburg, Kentucky. He was elected to the board of directors of the American Angus Association in 1974.

Born in Mt. Sterling, Kentucky, he attended Fleming County High School and Morehead State University and started in the Angus business in 1952 with a 4-H Angus heifer project. He is a pioneer in performance testing of beef cattle, having started testing in the Stone Gate Angus herd in 1958.

Active in state and local

beef cattle activities, he is a past president of the Kentucky Angus Association, as well as a number of other local livestock groups. In 1968 he was elected Kentucky Cattleman of the Year. Joe Neely, the newly-elected member of the board of directors from Franklin, Kentucky, purchased his first cow with a heifer calf at side as a 4-H club project.

He and his brother Ben run a 125-head cow herd and a farming operation that has been in the family since 1810. He is a graduate of Western Kentucky University, and has been active in many local and state Angus and beef cattle organizations.

Re-elected to their second full three year terms of office were Bill Bedingfield, Wil Mar Angus, Oilton, Oklahoma; William G. Conley, manager of Gibbet Hill Farm, Groton, Massachusetts; A.F. Flint, Rafter F Bar Ranch, Bard, New Mexico; and Henry Gardner, Gardner Angus Ranch, Ashland, Kansas. Five members are elected to the 15-person Angus board each year.
