

Cumberland DHIA cites record-making cows

BOLING SPRINGS — Cumberland County dairymen last Thursday night met and honored a number of dairymen for their outstanding dairy production records.

Paul Strock, R9, Mechanicsburg, was recognized as having the high herd average in milk production. Paul's herd of 121 Registered Holsteins produced an average of 18,767 pounds of milk.

John F. Stoltzfus, R5,

Shippensburg, was recognized as having the top herd in the production of Butterfat. His 44 Registered and Grade Holsteins produced an average of 660 lbs. of Butterfat.

In addition, one of John's cows, Ess Creek Vista Double Gal produced a record amount of butterfat this past year. Gal produced 978 pounds of butterfat in the 305 day test period. John was also recognized as having the top two-year old record

in fat. Jody's record as a two-year old was 769 pounds of fat.

Milkway Farms, R5, Shippensburg, received the high cow in Milk Production Award for having Bonnie produce 27,894 pounds of milk in a 305 day period. The 1980 Cumberland County DHIA High two year-old in milk award went to Roy Smoke, R1, Shippensburg, whose 2-year old Olga produced 21,074 pounds of milk.

The award for the most improved production this past year went to Roy Coover, R1 Carlisle

The Annual meeting and annual summary was dedicated to Corlan Farms, BE Martha, as a registered Holstein owned by Delmar Cornman. This mild mannered cow aided the county dairymen to bring part of the farm to school. As of the Spring of 1980, The Cumberland County dairy industry has presented their

program to over 18,000 students attending the 59 Elementary Schools in the nine school districts in the county.

Each student in kindergarten to fifth grade in the nine school districts has an opportunity to hear a dairyman discuss the importance of the dairy cow and the dairy farming for approximately 25 to 30 minutes. The dairyman presented the information to the students in groups of 40 in the school yard standing near "Martha the Cow"

Students had an opportunity to touch (pet) the cow as they left the presentation to go back to their class rooms to hear the Dairy Princess discuss the values of milk to one's diet and other interesting facts about milk.

It has been estimated that Martha attended school 41 days visiting 44 schools with enrollment of over 15,000 students. Galen Smith, Richard Lehman, M. Thomas Sheaffer, Donald
