



For 11 years Hasings has coordinated the planning committee that provides Extension talent for "Farm, Home and Garden" aired on KYW/TV in Philadelphia every weekday morning Each year county staff from southeastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware are involved in the 250 nine minute programs. In addition to her behind the scenes duties, Mrs. Hastings often appears on camera.

"Farm, Home and Garden," now in its 28th year, is the longest continually running TV show in the United States. It has a "50 share" rating, the highest of

any show broadcast in the Philadelphia area. It reaches 300,000 viewers each year.

The longevity of the program attests to Mrs. Hastings' and her committees ability to produce programs that meet today's need.
