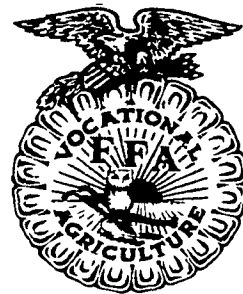

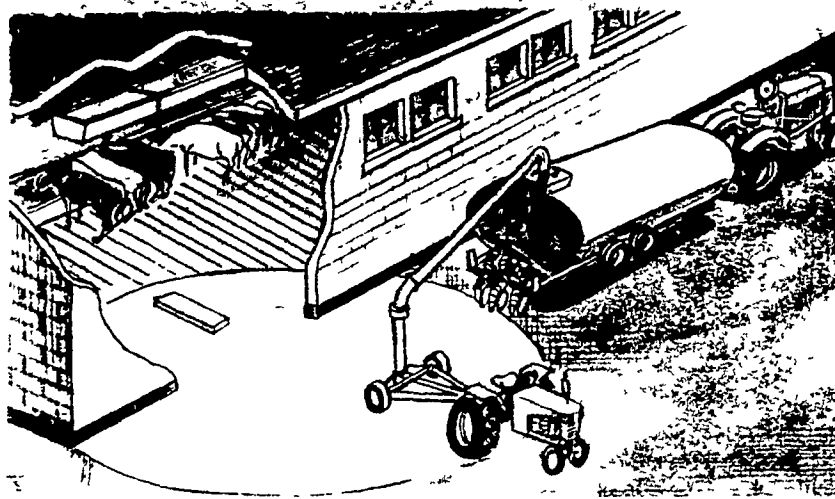
Also awarded were two \$100 checks to Doug Hersberger and Darell Dombach who are the County's Star Farmer and Star Agribusinessman for 1980.
