

County bull enters young sire program

LANDISVILLE — Atlantic Breeders Cooperative has selected Stonerdale Dewey to enter their young sire sampling program for 1980. He is one of 40 young Holstein bulls to enter the program this year.

Bred by Titus B. Stoner of Landisville, he will be known as 15H385 Dewey.

During sampling, Dewey will be randomly mated to approximately 600 Holstein cows through artificial insemination service in herds owned by Atlantic members. He will remain at Lancaster headquarters barns for the next four years as he continues to grow and await evaluation of his progeny.

If the results prove satisfactory, Dewey will then go into extensive service throughout the Cooperative's 12,000-member area and his semen may be marketed to other parts of

the world. The bloodlines in this young bull's pedigree are specially selected for Atlantic's breeding program. His sire, Simpson's Burkgov Snowman, is

in service at Atlantic, has been scored "Excellent" in body conformation and received the Gold Medal Sire award from the Holstein Association.

Dewey's dam, Stonerdale Apollo Dawn, has two records over 23,000 pounds of milk and 1000 pounds of butterfat in Stoner's herd. She is classified "Excellent."

Dawn's sire is Hilltop Apollo Ivanhoe, a former Atlantic sire.

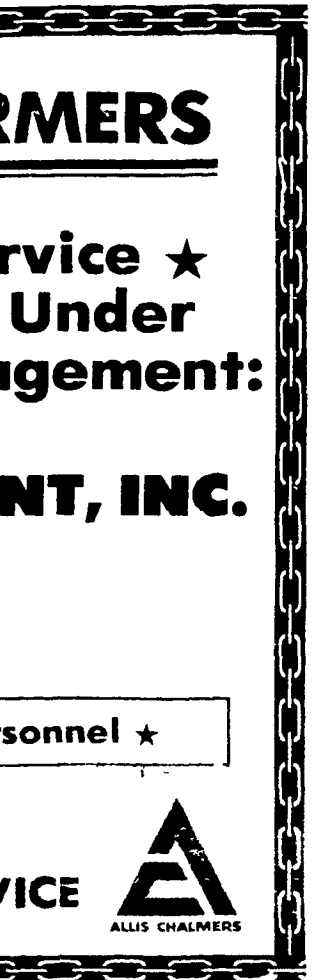

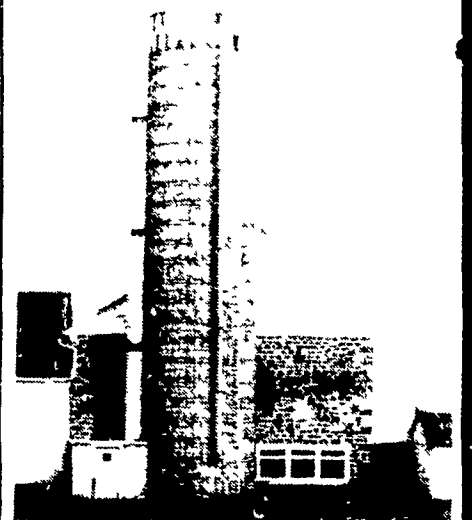

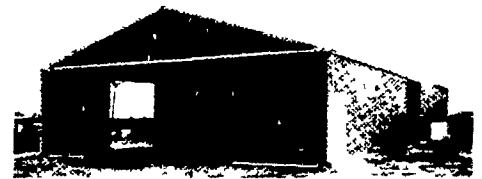
