Harford dairymen to elect director

PLYESVILLE, Md. — It's an election year in Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers' District 1 and the members of that area will hold their annual membership meeting Saturday, December 13 at North Harford High School in Pylesville, Md.

The 126 member-producers will nominate a director to be ratified by the total membership at the cooperative's annual meeting in March, for a three year term from March 1981 through February 1984.

Samuel B. Foard, Jr of Street, Md. is the incumbent

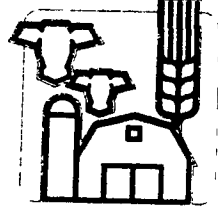
director whose term expires in February 1981

The remainder of the program, to begin with dinner at 7 p.m., will consist of reports on national and local milk production and the current status of Holly Milk Plant in Carlisle. In addition, members will be given an update on MCMP's financial condition, including its operating divisions, as well as the current status of the long-range planning commissioned at the 1979 annual meeting.

Reports will be given by MCMP president, Herbert W. Wessel of Hampstead, business manager Ralph L. Strock of Towson, and district directors Foard and Charles T. Edwards of Forest Hill. Field

representatives for the area are Tom Moore of Street and George Tyson of Port Deposit.

District 1 is made up solely of Harford County producers. These members have produced more than 67 million pounds of milk in 1980 through the month of September. Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers, Inc., the largest Maryland-based dairy cooperative, represents more than 1,000 dairy farmers in Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia.

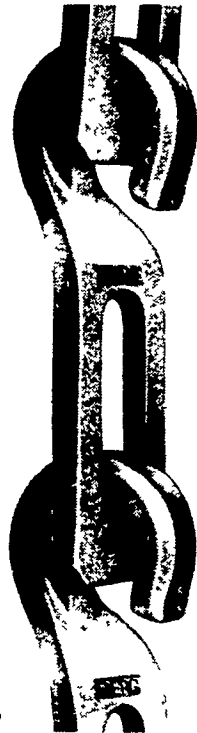
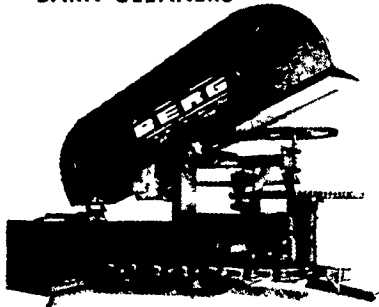

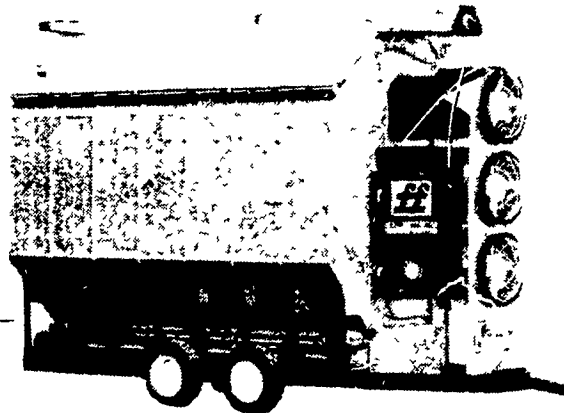
