



## Egg, poultry comments due by January 21

until January 21 to comment on the U.S. Department of Agriculture's poultry and egg grading and egg product inspection regulations

These regulations are currently being reviewed by USDA's Food Safety and Quality Service, as part of a USDA effort to eliminate unnecessary government regulations and make sure they are written simply and clearly, according to Donald L Houston, administrator of the agency.

The review is also designed to make sure USDA rules are consistent with legislative goals and do not overlap jurisdictions of other federal agencies, he said.

"We plan to conduct a comprehensive review of

A regulatory review task force appointed by Houston is conducting the reviews. The task force has already reviewed dairy grading regulations and plans to review other regulations in the coming months.

Comments on the regulations on grading of poultry, rabbits, shell eggs

and the inspection of egg products must be received by January 21. Notice of this review was published in the November 21 Federal Register, available in most local libraries.
