She credits John with being a big help in her business. "He constantly criticizes, advises and helps. With his background in plant diseases he knows who to go to for advice on caring for these materials. John is a plant pathologist with the Department of Agriculture."

Pattie says, "I'm always bartering with hunters. I trade corn husk flowers for one hunter's pheasant feathers." She also barters quail eggs for chicken eggs.

Nevertheless, she admits to being very cautious about her use of feathers and sprays them all before using them in decorations. She also freezes many of her grains for 48 hours to kill the grain moths, and then sprays them with a sealer.

She uses a lot of perilla, a common weed which grows alongside roads. "It's an inexpensive filler if it is mixed with baby's breath," Pattie explained. She also uses sudan, sorghum and sunflowers, which her family grows. "We have sunflowers for the birds and for the business," she states.

In working with honeysuckle, Pattie points out that it must be wet to be phable. "I like to work with it after a week of rain. She has also learned that wine grapevines do not have as many tendrils as wild vines."

In exchange for grapevines at pruning time at Tucquan Winery, Pattie barters her services to decorate their tasting room. She gets the vines in February and then spends about two weeks constantly weaving them into wreaths.

The children are also important to her business, helping with the gathering of materials. She pointed out that both children made several decorations to be sold at the AAUW's Holly Trail last weekend, where she displayed and demonstrated her work. "I'm glad to see them interested," Pattie says.

Pattie has a theory about why creations like her own are so popular. "I think so few people have ready access to living by the soil or access to nature. We take it so for granted what we can look out any window and see rabbits and pheasants. It's a rewarding fullness to live like that. I really feel I can bring a little of nature into the home that' part of it."

She likes her business for another reason. "It's a nice kind of experience. I never feel anyone is a customer -
