Hilton enters co-op stud

OXFORD — Pep-L-Lea a young bull bred by Robert Pepple of Oxford, Chester County, has been selected to enter the 1980 young sire sampling program at Atlantic Breeders Cooperative He is one of 40 Holstein bulls to enter the program this year and will be known as 15H387 Hilton.

During sampling, Hilton will be randomly mated to approximately 600 Holstein cows through artificial insemination service in herds owned by Atlantic members. He will remain at Lancaster headquarters barns for the next four years as he continues to grow and await evaluation of his progeny. If the results prove satisfactory, Hilton will go into extensive service throughout

the Cooperative's 11,000member area and his semen may be marketed to other parts of the world

The bloodines in this young bull's pedigree are specially selected for Atlantic's breeding program His sire, Wapa Arlinda Conductor, is classified "Excellent" in body conformation and received the Gold Medal Sire award earlier this year from the Holstein Association of America.

Hilton's dam, W-V-U Elevation Hulda has a 297-day production record of 17,610 pounds of milk and 663 pounds of fat at two years of age. She is classified Very Good at 87 points in body conformation in Pepple's herd Her sire is the well-
