

## Building firm to open new plant near Gettysburg

GETTYSBURG — Morton Buildings, Inc. of Morton, Illinois, a manufacturer of pre-engineered farm buildings, held ground-breaking ceremonies for a local plant on Tuesday.

The new facility, to be in operation by early summer, will be Morton's sixth manufacturing plant in the United States.

Other plant locations are Morton, Illinois, Winfield, Kansas, Spencer, Iowa, Goodfield, Illinois; and Kenton, Ohio. Service area for this new plant will be the Eastern Seaboard.

The new site is located six miles east of Gettysburg along U.S. 30. The plant will consist of two buildings 72 feet by 324 feet plus office space.

A maintenance shop will also be erected for Morton's truck fleet of 20 tractors and 40 trailers that are to be assigned to this plant.

On the same property, adjacent to the plant, Morton will have its own lumber yard covering eight to ten acres of land.

The new plant will be managed by Rod Weaver

presently employed by Morton in Kenton, Ohio. He will be supervising the progress prior to completions as well as aspects of production.

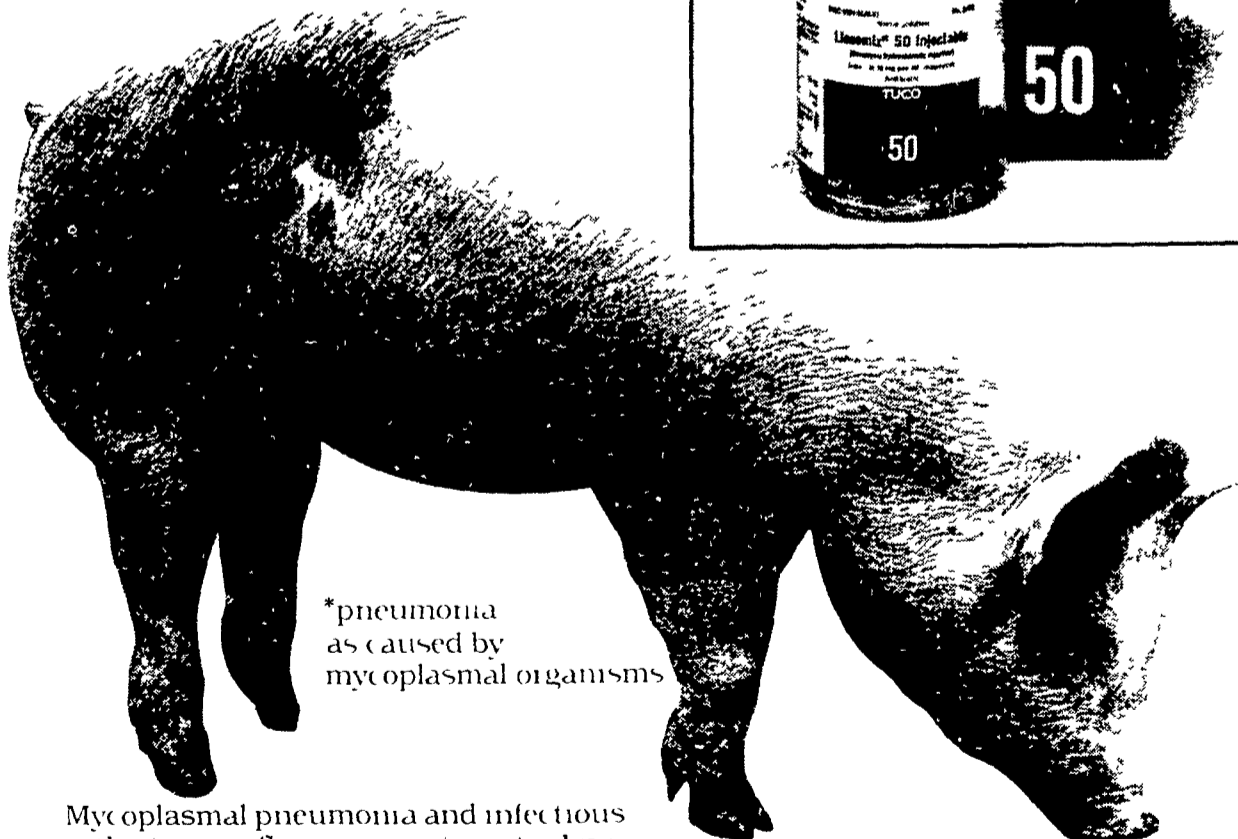
More than 70 persons will be hired locally to fill plant, office, and driver positions.

## Farm estate planning seminar on Jan. 8

CARLISLE — A seminar for estate planning professionals on farm estate planning is scheduled for 9 a.m. Jan. 8 at "The Embers", Carlisle, by the Penn State Extension Service.

The program, which has been organized by Area Farm Management Agent, Roland Freund, aims to equip accountants, attorneys, bank trust officers, insurance agents and family financial planners with a better understanding of the problem of farm families.

Income tax implications of farm estate planning will be discussed by atty Jeffrey S. Wachs, Lancaster Farm partnership agreements are to be presented by atty M. Elvin Byler, Lancaster. Anthony Campolo of Eastern College, St. Davids will analyze the problem of motivating the farmer client. Atty Richard L. Campbell, State College, will give the practical application and drafting of trust agreements for farm families. The program will

conclude with a farm estate planning update by Frederick A. Hughes, Penn State Farm Management Specialist.
