

an exhibit by more than 100 suppliers and manufacturers to the vegetable, fruit and small fruit growers in Pennsylvania, according to an announcement by Burton Hetherington, Conference Chairman of Berwick.

The conference/exhibit is an annual affair cosponsored by the Vegetable Growers of Pennsylvania, the State Horticultural Association, the Pennsylvania Grape and Wine Producers and the Pennsylvania Food Processors Association in cooperation with the extension and research divisions of Penn State's College of Agriculture.

Rudy Grob, Millersville, Chairman of Social Activities, said, "In addition to the business meetings and exhibits, several socials will be held including two dinners on February 3 and 4, and a Tomato luncheon on February 3.

Charles Wismer, Pennsylvania Grange Master will address the group on February 4, at the annual banquet, a highlight of the get-together of state growers

Warren Thompson, Clarks Summit, President of the Pennsylvania Vegetable Growers Association, said that the conference is open to anyone interested in the growing of vegetables in Pennsylvania.


