



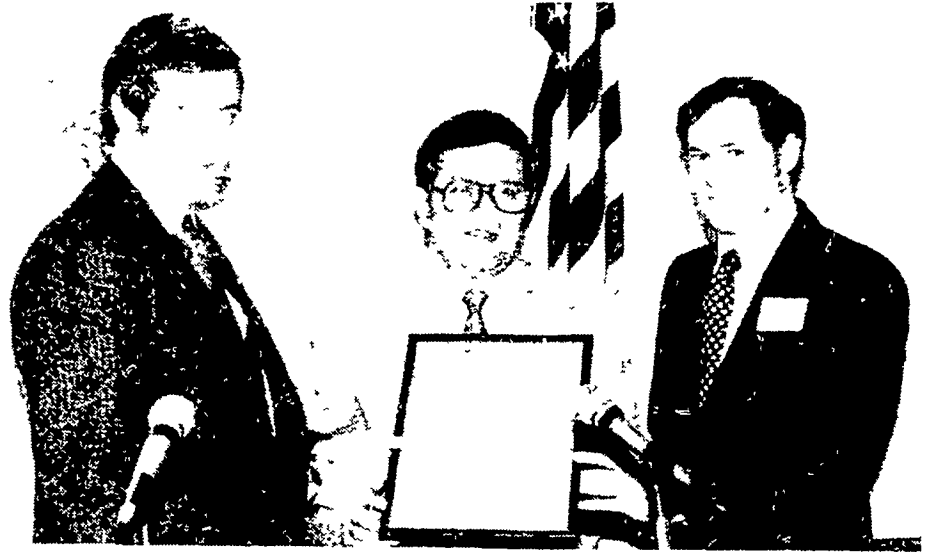

Robert Hodge, president and general manager of Highland Orchards, Chester County, was selected as one of last year's Master Farmers.

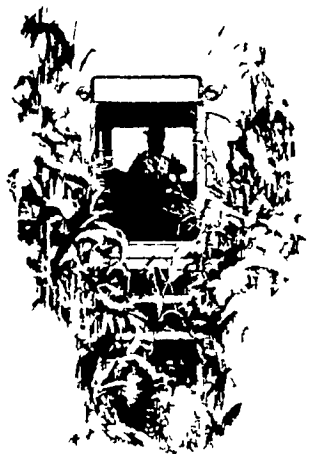
