Red meat production drops 10 percent

HARRISBURG — Commercial red meat production in Pennsylvania during November totaled 80.1 million pounds, down ten percent from November 1979. Cattle slaughter at 62,000 head was down from one percent while calf slaughter at 21,500 head was

up three percent from last year.

Hog slaughter at 254,000 head decreased 17 percent from a year ago. The number of sheep and lambs slaughtered totaled 12,700, down four percent from November 1979.

Nationally, commercial red meat production during November totaled 3.10 billion pounds, a decrease of six percent from November

1979.

Beef production at 1.71 billion pounds was down four percent, while veal production at 31 million pounds was down six percent.

Pork production totaled 1.34 billion pounds, down nine percent from November 1979.

Lamb and mutton production increased nine percent to 25 million pounds.
