- 1/2 cup margarine
- 1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup enriched flour
- 1 cup finely chopped nuts

Cream margarine and add powdered sugar and vanilla. Add flour gradually then add nuts. Form cookies the size of little fingers. Bake at 370 degrees for 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned when cool. Roll in powdered sugar.

Yummy Cookies

- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup butter or lard
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoon water
- 2 1/8 cup sifted flour
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2/3 teaspoons raisins
- 2/3 cups chopped nuts

Cream together the sugar and shortening, add well beaten eggs and water, flour sifted with salt, baking powder and cinnamon. Last of all the raisins and nuts, well dusted with flour. Mix thoroughly.

Egg production increases six percent

HARRISBURG — November 1980 egg production in Pennsylvania totaled 360 million according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. The November production was six percent above the 341 million eggs produced in November 1979.

The November average of 16.8 million layers was three percent higher than a year ago. Egg production per 100 layers was 2,140 compared with 2,079 in November 1979.

The nation's laying flocks produced 5.77 billion eggs during November, slightly below the 5.79 billion produced a year ago.

The number of layers for

November averaged 293 million compared with 295 million a year earlier. Egg production per 100 layers during the month was 1976 compared with 1977 a year ago.
