Egg production increases six percent

HARRISBURG November 1980 egg production in Pennsylvania totaled 360 million according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service The November production was six percent above the 341 million eggs produced in November 1979.

The November average of 16 8 million layers was three percent higher than a year ago. Egg production per 100 lavers was 2 140 compared with 2,079 in November 1979.

The nation's laying flocks produced 5.77 billion eggs during November, slightly below the 579 billion produced a year ago

The number of layers for

November averaged 293 million compared with 295 million a year earlier. Egg production per 100 layers during the month was 1976 compared with 1977 a year


