Worship service at Farm Show

HARRISBURG — A non-denominational worship service will be held at 11 30 a. m., Sunday, January 11, to herald the opening of the 65th Annual Pennsylvania State Farm Show.

State Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell said the service, in the main arena at the Farm Show Complex, has been scheduled to accommodate out-of-town visitors who wish to attend the opening day festivities.

"In the past," Hallowell said, "many people who wanted to attend the one o'clock ceremonies were forced to decide between

church and the Farm Show. This worship service provides the opportunity for out-of-town guests to do both."

The service was arranged through the Pennsylvania Council of Churches under the direction of the Reverend Paul D Gehris, director of the council's Office of Social Ministry.

Delivering the sermon, "Loyalty to our Best", will be the Reverend William G. Rusch, executive director of The Synod of the Trinity of the United Presbyterian Church of America.

Rusch received a bachelor of divinity degree in 1950 at Western Theological Seminary. He and his wife Ruth have four children.

Mrs. Grace Lawrence, coordinator of Ecumenical Action of Church Women United in Pennsylvania, will also participate in the worship service.

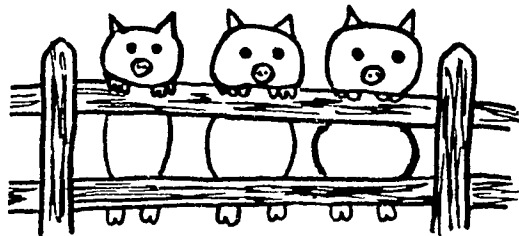
