## Did you know?

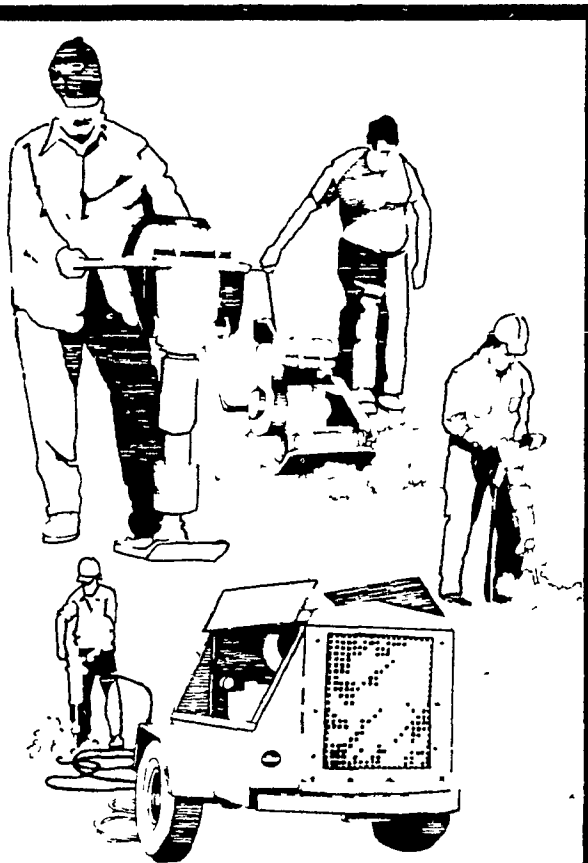
Do you ever hear dad talking about his acres? He says I have so many acres of this and so many acres of that and you probably even brag about it in school. But do you know how much an acre is?
