is a member of the varsity basketball and soccer teams. On his way to the top, Clowser had to beat a number of top-notch steers, including the reserve grand champion steer shown by

Lancaster County's Ernie Frey. Frey's Chianina x Angus steer followed the grand champion all the way up the line, placing second in class, reserve heavyweight champion and finally reserve grand champion.

Sixteen-year-old Frey exhibited last year's grand champion Farm Show steer. He is the son of Ernie and Linda Frey of R2 Quarryville and has been a member of the Lancaster County 4-H Club for 7 years.

Ernie wasn't the only Frey to bring championship honors to Lancaster County.

Cousin Fritz Frey, son of Fred and June Frey, showed his Chianina x Angus steer to the lightweight champion honors. And Bonnie Frey, daughter of Adolf and Gloria Frey, had the middleweight champion steer. All three steers were bred by Fred Frey.

Gerald Hess, another Lancaster County 4-H'er showed his crossbred steer to reserve light heavyweight champion.

Other division champions included. Ricki Seese, Fayette County, light heavyweight champion; Emily Livingston, York County, reserve lightweight champion, and Doug Deppen, Dauphin County, reserve middleweight champion.
