Records fall at sheep-to-shawl contest

FARM SHOW — Pennsylvania's First Lady Ginny Thornburgh gave the countdown and shears started buzzing at the Second Annual Northeast Regional Sheep to Shawl Contest held in the jam-packed small arena of the Pennsylvania Farm Show Wednesday evening.

Record times were recorded as the spinning wheels whirled and weavers' shuttles flew. Ten teams of five members each representing Pennsylvania and Maryland raced against the clock to make a 75-inch long, 22-inch wide and 100 percent wool shawl.

The Fancy Flock Flyers came out on top with a time of 83 minutes. Their blue, grey and natural white shawl was a combination of hand dipped and tie dying. Team members included weaver Carol Buskirk of Linglestown, Dauphin County; spinners Dianne Dilger of Lebanon, Lebanon County; Jummie Hepford of Summerdale, Cumberland County; Joanne Higgins of Harrisburg, Dauphin County, and sheep shearer Glenn Seibert of Lebanon.

An auction of the top six shawls followed the contest. Richard E Brandt, Farm Real Estate of Reading, Berks County, was the successful bidder at a record price of \$260. The team also received \$150 in premiums, a traveling trophy sponsored

by the Pennsylvania Sheep & Wool Growers Association, and a wood plaque sponsored by The Mannings Studio of East Berlin, Adams county.

Judging was based on a variety of factors, including 30 points for speed and 30 points for design of the shawl. Other considerations worth a total of 40 points included spinning, weaving, shearing and team identification. A panel of three judges officiated the contest. They were Betty Oldenburg of Lebanon, New Jersey; Jean Woodward of Mount Airy, Maryland; and Florence Hall of Keymar, Maryland.

In a record time of 63 minutes, the Lancaster Niddy-Noddies, using a window pane design, placed second. The team was awarded \$120 plus a plaque sponsored by auctioneer Harry Bachman of Anville, Lebanon County. Team members included weaver Dotty Lewis of Lancaster; Phillis Robinson of Lancaster, Berks County; Barb Lynch of Pequea, Lancaster County, and Dave Eckman of Lancaster. Audrey Shirk of Lebanon was the successful bidder of this shawl at \$190.

Using a unique original design of slits in the shawl which could be worn three different ways, last year's winning team, the Pennsylvania Wool Workers,

captured third place. Team members included weaver Cheryl Mampe of Bendersville, Adams County; spinners Sharon Worley of Camp Hill, Cumberland County; Ginny Leber, also of Camp Hill, Berks County; and shearer Scott Murdoch of Gettysburg, Adams County.

Mrs Sadie Heim, wife of Deputy Pennsylvania Agriculture Secretary E Chester Heim, purchased this shawl at \$150.

The Washington Spinners and Weavers Guild, wearing hand woven heirloom patterned attire, captured fourth place spot with their natural colored shawl. Dennis Grumbine of Lebanon was the successful bidder at \$120.

Carl Wenger of Wenger's Farm Machinery in Lebanon purchased the fifth place shawl at \$120. The shawl was

made by Shear Madness of Maryland.

Showing county unity, State Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell from Ottsville, Bucks County, was the successful bidder on the sixth place shawl at \$120. The shawl was made by the Bucks-Montgomery County Wool Pool Fools.

Other teams participating in the contest included the Romney Rovers of Maryland; the Montrose Spinners of Montrose County; Ridley Creek Craft Guild North of Chester and Delaware Counties; and Ridley Creek Craft South representing Pennsylvania and Maryland.

Each participant was presented a Certificate of Excellence in Wool sponsored by the American Sheep Producers Council. Auctioneering the contest was Harry Bachman of Anville, Lebanon County.

Carcass lamb, wool winners

FARM SHOW — Julie Kuzemchak of Pleasant Gap, Centre County, exhibited the grand champion carcass lamb at the 65th annual Pennsylvania Farm Show.

Julie's 126-pound lamb, shown in the heavyweight division, placed first in the division both on-foot and on-rail, with a carcass weight of 70 pounds. The carcass will be sold during Friday's junior market auctions.

Last year's champion carcass lamb, shown by Barbara Herr of Harvon, Lancaster County, sold for a record \$7.00 per pound.

The reserve champion carcass lamb was exhibited by Champion Acres of Fayette County.

This 126-pound lamb, which weighed in at 66 pounds on-rail, placed second both on-foot and on-rail in the heavyweight division.

Champion Acres also showed the champion carcass lamb in the lightweight division, a 102-pounder which weighed 54 pounds on-rail. Reserve champion honors in the lightweight division went to a 102-pound lamb shown by Joyce Witt of Champion. Her lamb weighed in at 50 pounds on-rail.

Carcass lambs are placed according to USDA yields, with special considerations for increases in quality grade, conformation, carcass yield and loin eye area.
