

## MacCauley wins sheep showmanship

FARM SHOW — William J. MacCauley III, R1, Atglen, capped a successful day in junior breeding sheep competition on Wednesday by capturing the coveted junior lamb champion showmanship award.

Earlier, the 15-year-old Chester County exhibitor had swept the Suffolk class top awards. In addition, he notched a second and third in heavyweight market lamb competition.

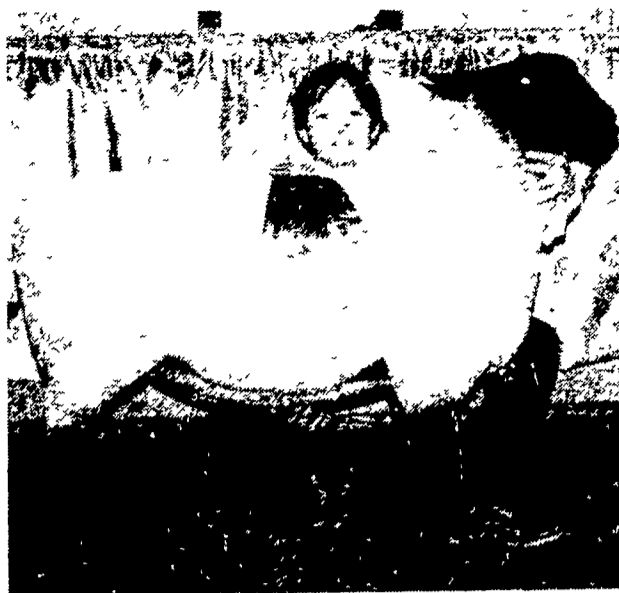
The slightly built exterior skillfully guided his entry in the crowded 15 years and over showmanship class.

Judge G. Monte Chappell, of Lexington, Ky., even remarked that the lamb must weigh at least twice what its handler tipped the scales.

## Adams farmers to discuss land preservation

YORK SPRINGS — Preserving the family farm will be the emphasis for the 65th annual meeting of the Adams County Agricultural and Home Economics Extension Association scheduled for 6:30 p.m., Thursday, January 22, 1981 in the new firehall in York Springs.

Amos Funk, farmer and soil conservation leader from R1, Millersville, Lancaster County, will focus attention on the topic when he speaks on "Farmland Preservation What it Will Mean to You".

Funk has been in the forefront with farm leaders seeking methods to preserve the family farm.

Governor Dick Thornburgh visited his farm recently when he signed legislation changing the inheritance tax laws to encourage continued use of farmlands for agriculture. This law will value farm property at the "use value" rather than the higher market value. Members of family farm operations are often forced to sell the

land because they cannot pay the inheritance tax.
