GRANTVILLE - George W Stone, president of the National Farmers Union, comes across as a man who knows what he's after but who is willing to take half a loat now in hopes of getting the rest later

Stone, who is serving his first year as presdient of NFU, was in Pennsylvania this week to address the ninth annual meeting of the Pennsylvania Farmers Union

The question of dairy parity was one of the first discussed in his exclusive interview with Lancaster Farming. NFU long has been on record as supporting 100 percent of parity for all taim crops

The 100 percent idea is tine, but right now we aim to get as high as we can, Stone said explaining why NFU is on record as supporting 80 percent of parity for dairy tarmers

At 80 percent of parity the established tarmer will be able to make it OK, Stone

We will be fortunate to

keep dairy parity where it is, he said

But, he continued, tor a farmer to get proper return on investment farm product prices must reach 100 percent of parity

Of course, 100 percent of parity for grain prices will mean hog and cattle farmers will have to pay more for their basic imput feed

The price all farmers get has to be realistic. The tarmer will get better prices and the consumer will be better off once the ups and downs caused by the current pricing method are leveled out, Stone said

All segments are entitled to a profit If the price has to go up, it has to go up

Noted as an outspoken champion of the family tarm, Stone made his mark in the battle against having tamily tarms engulted by corporations of foreign investers during his fiveyear stint as vice president ot NFU

A native of Olkahoma. where he served as president of the 90,000 member Oklahoma Farmers Union tor almost 20 years starting

home state has some of the answers other states seek in the land ownership question.
