# USDA wants to change packer, stockyard rules

NEW YORK, N.Y Members of the livestock and meat industry and the public are invited to comment until March 2 on changes in packers and stockyards' program regulations proposed by the U.S Department of Agriculture

The first phase of an ongoing general review of regulations issued under the Packers and Stockyards' Act has produced several

proposed revisions," James L Smith, a packers and stockyards official with USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, said.

Smith said the significant changes include a proposed substantial reduction in the information required to be included in annual reports submitted by livestock dealers and market agencies, a change which would greatly reduce the time spent in filling out reports

We are also proposing that the custodial accounts for shippers' proceeds could be maintained in interestbearing savings accounts, Smith said These accounts are required to ensure prompt payment to consignors of livestock, but there is no reason that the money involved should not be put to work, provided it is properly designated as part of the custodial account

Smith said the revisions

American. Coming of Age, was designed by Peggy Bailey, Director of the Green Thumb at Bloomsburg State College.


