### Berks dairy club meets


FLEEIWOOD - Ine Eastern Berks 4-H dairy club met January 23 at the Fleetwood bank

A dairy bowl contest was planned and members were picked for this event



4-H is the youth development program of the Penn State Cooperative Extension Service. Members of over 35 county 4-H clubs learn by doing


4-H clubs are now accepting new members and volunteer leaders Membership is open to all county youth, ages 8-19
