The program, held at the Trinity Lutheran Church, featured various projects on which the New Holland area clubs are working Some of them are handyman, rabbit and pet care



No, say representatives of the Maple Syrup Producers Color isn't even a factor considered in judging. Judges look for consistency in texture and appearance




